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7.2.1 BEST PRACTICES

PRACTICE-1

Title: Transforming students into better individuals through faculty and professional mentorship.

Objectives of the Practice:

- 1) Providing academic guidance and support to improve student performance.
- 2) Offering mentorship for professional growth and career planning.
- 3) Assisting and guiding on personal matters to promote overall well-being.
- 4) Creating a supportive environment for students to effectively handle challenges.
- 5) Building strong student-teacher relationships to foster open communication and trust.
- 6) Enhancing the overall learning experience and academic success through personalized support for student's retention and satisfaction.
 - 7) Encouraging self-reflection and goal-setting for personal and academic development.

Context:

During their four-year undergraduate program, students often seek support, advice, and counselling in academic, professional, and personal matters, often looking to a caring elder for guidance. To meet this need, the Institute has established a Mentoring System, with the goal of cultivating stronger and more meaningful student-teacher relationships to help students address the daily challenges encountered. This supportive process continues until the student completes undergraduate program and is primarily conducted by:

- I. Faculty Mentors
- II. Students Mentoring and Counselling Centre (SMC)




The Practice:

The mentoring is carried out broadly under different levels as Faculty mentor, Class Coordinator, Professional Counsellor, and Heads.

The Class coordinators dealt with the academic related issues of the students while the Faculty mentors, Professional counsellors and Heads look after other issues of the student ranging from academic to personal development and counselling.

The details of the process of mentoring is as explained below.



I. Faculty Mentor: Faculty mentoring is carried out by adopting following steps;

- 1) Allotment of Mentor Coordinator and Mentor
- 2) Mentor- Mentees Meeting
- 3) Resolution of student issues
- 4) Communication with parents
- 5) Evaluation of strengths and weaknesses
- 6) Updating the status of Campus recruitment drives



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7) Updating the results status of the students

A comprehensive template is prepared to maintained mentoring including various parameters like personal information, live results, mentee profile, meeting attendance, cocurricular activities etc. During Covid-19 a special mentoring program was launched asking students family status and needs. A google form was floated for the same. Based on the inputs possible help were provided to needy family.

II. Students Mentoring and Counselling Center (SMC):

Institute has a dedicated Students Mentoring and Counselling (SMC) center headed by a senior faculty member, taking help of coordinators from each program and hiring professional counsellors. The professional counsellors are available in the campus 4 days per week.

The objectives of the centre covers:

- Academic Support
- Personal Development
- Mental Health Support
- Conflict Resolution
- Outreach and Awareness etc.

Overall, the mentoring and counselling cell aims to empower students to overcome challenges, maximize their potential, and thrive academically, personally, and professionally during their college journey. The centre starts its working from planning of activities, awareness of importance of counselling to the group and individual counselling.

Evidence of Success:

- During the mentor mentee interaction many of the students share their problems, doubts from academic, financial problems, domestic issues etc. the mentors guide them handle situation efficiently.
- Many of the students who desperately needed counselling got the facility at the college itself.
- A total of 123 students were counseled at individual level, of whom 8 were facing

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critical issues and needed counseling.

 A total of 39 workshops on different topics ranging from behavioral modification, internet addiction, relationship issues were delivered resulting in 2164 beneficiaries through the year 2022-2024.

Problems Encountered:

Student Engagement & Feedback: Due to shyness and lack of confidence and interest, few students did not meet mentors on regular basis. Assessing the effectiveness of mentorship programs and providing constructive feedback to mentors and mentees is challenging.





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7.2.1 BEST PRACTICES

PRACTICE-2

Title: Inter-departmental Academic Audit

Objectives of the Practice:

The inter-departmental academic audit is a crucial practice aimed at ensuring accountability, maintaining high academic standards, and continuously enhancing the teaching-learning process to deliver quality education. Its primary objectives are to establish a culture of transparency and accountability within academic institutions and to foster a commitment to excellence in education.

Context:

In the context of modern educational institutions, where the focus is shifting towards outcome-based education and continuous improvement, the need for robust quality assurance mechanisms like the inter-departmental academic audit is paramount. This practice serves as a proactive approach to address the challenges faced by academic institutions in maintaining high standards of education and meeting the expectations of various stakeholders, including students, parents, and accrediting bodies.

The Practice:

The inter-departmental academic audit is a comprehensive process that involves the systematic review of academic programs and activities across different schools and departments within the institue. It is conducted three times in academic semester and employs rubrics-based marking for evaluating various parameters related to the teaching-learning process.

The aspects of this practice are to focus on outcome based education by means of reviewing mapping of course outcomes with program outcomes, target setting, planning of course delivery, slow and advanced learner activities, and calculations of the outcomes from both direct and indirect ways of attainment. The audit is divided into four parts: preterm, mid-



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term, post-term, and post-result audits, which is practically match the academic flow. Faculty members are being appreciated and reprimanded based on their scores of these audits. The final scores of odd and even semester academic audits are linked with the performance appraisal mechanism, ensuring timely management of academic work by the faculty

members.

By assessing these aspects against predefined standards and benchmarks, the audit helps identify areas that require improvement and provides valuable insights for enhancing the overall quality of education.

Evidence of Success:

Few of the tangible outcomes of the inter-departmental academic audit is the timely completion of academic documentations and implementation of uniformly defined quality teaching-learning process. It has garnered effective implementation of outcome-based

education at the course level, which is the base of OBE implementation in any institution.

By ensuring that all academic processes are documented and reviewed periodically as per predefined qualitative rubrics, the academic audit helps maintain uniformity, transparency and accountability in the system.

Problems Encountered:

The post-result audit has to be done in the next semester as it depends on university results declaration which generally gets declared by the mid of the next semester. This delays the preparation of complete audit report.

Since multiple auditors are involved in the process and faculty members of various programs acts as auditors, it has been observed that all auditors do not have common understanding of various parameters' rubrics.

Outcome: Parents appreciated the session and their feedback has been recorded. In general, the PTM was conducive and fruitful.





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

To overcome this challenge a seminar conducted named "Goal Setting".



To avoid this consequence it is extremely important for the students to set life goals which shall help them to remain on a steady path in life even after encountering distractions.

So with this intended purpose a session on "Goal Setting in Life" was organized for the students of Computer Engineering Department on the 25th January 2023.

The session was conducted by Ms.Meraj Mir, the Institute-appointed Professional Psychologist, having vast experience in counseling and mentoring students of various educational institutes as well as corporate human resource. 

DESCRIPTION OF EVENT:

Exam time is one of the most stressful time in a students life. One of the major reason for this stress is piled up lessons to be studied and the fear of failing in exams. If students manage their time effectively each of their learning tasks can be effectively completed well before time leading to less stress during the exam period. With this aim of teaching the students how to manage exam related stress a counseling session was conducted on the topic "Managing Stress By Time Management" by our Institute-appointed Professional Psychologist Ms. Meraj Mir on 16th February 2023 for the students of Second Year Computer Engineering.

The session started by asking students the reason behind their fear of examinations. Insufficient preparation was the major reason stated by the students for this fear of exams. The expert then explained them their insufficient preparation is majorly because of poor time management practices. The expert then discussed with students the role of mobile and social media as a major contributor in the wastage of time e.g by starting to watch reels of few second duration students end up watching many such reels by getting into endless scrolling habit for entertainment. Student were guided to limit their usage of mobile particularly for browsing social media. The students were then given a plan that they can follow to utilize time effectively for the upcoming Unit test exam preparations.

TIME MANAGEMENT ACTIVITY:

The last part of the session was a very creative activity that can greatly help the students for Time Management. As part of this activity the students were asked to list down all the activities that are part of their daily routine. Next the students were asked to make a quadrant on a sheet of paper.

The students were asked to categorize their activities in the 4 quadrants based on the criterias:

- i) Important But Not Urgent
- ii) Urgent
- iii) Not Urgent but Important
- iv) Not Urgent Not Important

The activities falling in the 4th category are the ones that are our Time waster Activities which must be eliminated from our schedule.


